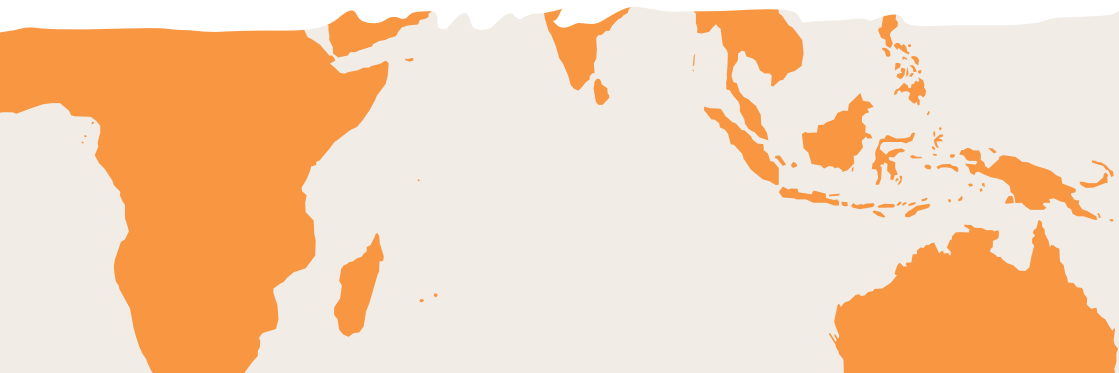

# India

 = 1,832,760 beneficiaries

For millions of families in rural India, food insecurity is the baseline. **Seasonal labour, unpredictable harvests**, and the absence of any meaningful social safety net mean that protein-rich food like **meat is simply not part of daily life**. In fact, many entire communities go months without it.

On Eid al-Adha, whether a family gets to mark it with a meal depends entirely on whether someone outside their community chooses to act. This year, **your Qurban answered that question for over 1.8 million people** across India.



# Palestine

 = 50,520 beneficiaries

**Life in the West Bank is defined by restriction.**

Checkpoints, permit systems, settlement expansion, and movement controls shape every aspect of daily existence, where people can work, where they can travel, what they can access. **The economic consequences are severe:** unemployment is high, incomes are suppressed, and basic goods are often difficult or expensive to obtain.

For many families, the ability to give or receive Qurban, a core practice of this Eid, is out of reach without external support. This year, **over 50 thousand people in the West Bank received your Qurban.** It did not solve what they are living through, but it meant they marked Eid with dignity.



# Words Of Thanks

**Abu Bakar, 69** — *West Bengal, India*

Abu Bakar lives in a remote village in West Bengal with his three dependants. **Unemployed and without a stable income**, the household relies on the basics, rice and lentils, and meat is rarely within reach.

This Eid, through the Qurban project, Abu Bakar's family **received fresh meat for the first time in a long time**. It was more than a meal. For a household that struggles daily just to meet basic food needs, it was relief, nutrition, and a moment of dignity during what can otherwise feel like just another hard day.

# Words Of Thanks

**Saharjan Bibi, 44** — *West Bengal, India*

Saharjan Bibi is **raising two children alone**. She takes whatever work she can find, sewing, household cleaning, but it rarely covers everything the family needs. **Food insecurity is a constant**. Meat is not part of their normal diet.

Before this year, Eid al-Adha was not a day of celebration for her family. It was simply another difficult day.

Through the Qurban project, Saharjan received fresh meat and was able to cook a proper Eid meal for her children, **for the first time in years**. A single distribution, and the day became something different.
